Chapter 1 - I've Been Moved

Aim/Objectives:

- 1. How can we describe Jack's feelings at the beginning of the story? Jack is sad and confused.
- 2. Why does he feel this way? What happened to him? He was moved to a new home, and he is frequently being sent outdoors.

(Revised Bloom's Taxonomy - Understanding)

- What is Grandpa doing at the beginning of the story? Why is
 he doing this? Grandpa is banging a pan with a spoon and
 chasing the two dogs out of the house because he believes
 dogs should stay outdoors.
- 2. What is the slippery stuff that makes Jack's butt cold? Jack refers to the snow as "slippery stuff". He's not familiar with snow because he lived in Florida before moving in with the Fernandez family.
- 3. Who is New Master? Who are the other members of Jack's new family? Jack refers to the father in his new family as New Master and to the mother as Nice Lady. They have three children, two girls and a little boy.

- 4. Jack says that life on the farm is different from life in the city? How is it different? Jack is living with more than one person now, sharing the yard with noisy animals, and playing on snow instead of grass.
- 5. Who is Angelica? Compare and contrast Jack and Angelica. How are they the same? How are they different? Jack and Angelica are both dogs, but Jack is much larger. He's a Labrador Retriever and she's a Chihuahua. Jack is younger and is very active, while Angelica is older and sleeps a lot.
- 6. Why does Nice Lady let Jack out the back door every afternoon? Nice Lady lets Jack out the back door in the afternoon so he can meet Melanie and Lily as they come home from school.
- 7. When the kids enter the back door of the house, they're in the mud room. What do they do in that room? They take off their coats and boots and put on clean shoes.
- 8. What does Grandpa do as soon as the dogs come into the back door with the children? Why does he do this? Grandpa shouts and tells the dogs to go outside because he thinks that's where they belong.
- 9. Why do Melanie and Lily protest when Grandpa tries to send the dog outside again? What do they say is out there? The

- girls protest because they want the dogs inside the house with them. They hear coyotes outside and are worried about the dogs' safety.
- 10. What does Grandpa say he will build for the dogs? Where does he think the dogs should stay until he builds it? Grandpa says he will build a doghouse. Until then, he thinks the dogs should stay in the barn.
- 11. Does Grandma agree with Grandpa about dogs on the farm staying outdoors? What does she say about this? Grandma says that she and Grandpa are living at the farmhouse temporarily, and it is not their place to tell the family what to do.
- 12. Why are Grandma and Grandpa living in the farmhouse temporarily? What happened to their cottage? There was a fire that greatly damaged Grandma and Grandpa's cottage, so they had to move out for a while.
- 13. Why does Grandma say that the girls should not be upset with Grandpa? What does Melanie say about how Grandpa has changed? Grandma says that Grandpa doesn't see as well as he used to and is a little irritable. Melanie says that Grandpa also forgets things more often.

- 14. Why does Grandma sneeze a lot? What does Grandpa do when Grandma sneezes? Why? We can infer, or figure out, that Grandma sneezes because she's allergic to dogs.

 Because of this, Grandpa chases the dogs out of the house.
- 15. What do Melanie and Lily want Grandpa to stop saying about Jack and Angelica? Why? The girls want Grandpa to stop saying that the dogs should live in a doghouse or in the barn with the other animals. They want the dogs to live with them in the farmhouse.
- 16. Referring to Grandpa, what does Nice Lady say is not easy?

 Nice Lady says it's not easy when people insist on having everything their way.
- 17. Why do the girls have to get their homework done after school? What do they have to do after dinner? Melanie and Lily have to get their homework done after school because they have to help with a few chores in the evening.
- 18. What does Jack think about Grandpa building a doghouse? Jack is confused because he has never even seen a doghouse before.
- 19. Did Jack ever hear of a dog living in a doghouse or a barn before? Where did he and his old master live? He and his old

- master lived in the same house. Jack didn't know dogs could live in a doghouse or in the barn.
- 20. Before Jack came to live at the farm, what did his old master do with him every day? Does Jack want to stay in his new home at the farm or go back to his old master's house? Why? Jack's old master played ball with him every day, so Jack wishes he could play with him again.

Chapter 2 - Farm Life

- 1. What do Grandma and Nice Lady do on the farm? What do they make? They cook for the family. They also prepare and package foods such as fruits, vegetables, herbs, and goat cheese. These items, as well as soap they make from goat's milk, are sold at the farmers' market.
- 2. How do Melanie and Lily help their mom and grandmother with the food and other items that they have prepared? The girls help stack the boxes of food on the back porch. Then they use a wheeled cart to bring the boxes to the truck.
- 3. Do shoppers at the farmers' market like the products sold by the Ferandez Family Farm? How do you know? The shoppers like the family's products. Nice Lady tells Grandma that customers have been looking for the Fernandez Family Farm sign and that their stand is among the first to sell out.
- 4. In what town is the farm located? The farm is located in Autumn Blaze.
- 5. Each merchant at the farmers' market loads some of the items they have brought with them onto a truck. Why do they do this? The truck is from a charity that feeds the

- hungry. The farmers want to help people who cannot afford to buy food for their families.
- 6. Does the family like donating some of their products to charity? How do you know? Yes, in fact Nice Lady tells Grandma that their goal is to try to donate a little more each week.
- 7. What is Grandpa in charge of doing on the farm? Grandpa helps milk the goats and cows, and he feeds all the animals.
- 8. Why does Grandpa say that the children need to be disciplined? Grandpa says the children need to be disciplined because they keep letting the dogs back in the house after he got them to go outside.
- 9. Why doesn't Jack like dog food? His old master didn't give Jack dog food, so he's not used to eating it.
- 10. Does Jack seem to like the cold weather at the farm? What does he say? Jack isn't used to the cold weather. He says that when he stands his paws are freezing. When he sits, his butt is also freezing.
- 11. Does the cat on the farm seem to like cat food? What else might the cat be eating on the farm? The cat laps up the milk that Grandpa gives it, but doesn't eat the cat food

- Grandpa puts out. Since the cat sits on the old fence licking its chops, perhaps it finds other things to eat, such as mice.
- 12. What does New Master do on the farm? Does Grandpa help? How does he help? Grandpa helps New Master filter the pails of milk into jugs, label the jugs, and put them in the refrigerator. Also, he lets the sheep out to pasture and helps New Master clean out the barn.
- 13. Melanie and Lily go to school. How old is Ben? When will he start school? Ben will be four years old in a few months, so he will go to prekindergarten in the fall.
- 14. Which child spends the most time with Jack? What do they do together? Ben spends the most time with Jack. Ben makes up games for them to play outdoors.
- 15. Is Jack getting used to the snow? How do you know? After playing outside for a while, Jack starts running and jumping in the snow just like Ben.
- 16. What do Melanie and Lily like to do when they have some free time? They like to try on different clothes and put hats on the dogs. Also, they like to write songs together and sing their songs.

- 17. How old are Melanie and Lily? What else does Lily like to do? Melanie is ten years old, and Lily is seven years old. Lily likes to draw pictures.
- 18. What does New Master like to do in his spare time? New Master likes to play the guitar and sing. He also hums a lot.
- 19. What does Jack say about life with his old master compared to life on the farm? Jack says that life with his old master was a lot calmer.
- 20. Was it easy for Jack to be moved to a new home? How do you know? Jack misses his life with his old master. He wants to see him again.

Chapter 3 – An Outdoor Game

- 1. What does Melanie offer to make for her sister and brother after they've been playing outside in the snow? She offers to make them hot chocolate.
- 2. What is different about Grandma that makes Lily notice something has changed? Lily notices that Grandma is not sneezing anymore.
- 3. What does Grandpa do that Lily doesn't like? He keeps trying to send Angelica and Jack outside.
- 4. Grandma explains the reason for Grandpa's views. What does she say? Grandma explains that Grandpa grew up on a farm where the animals were kept outside all the time.
- 5. Who seems to be more old-fashioned, Grandma or Grandpa? How do you know? Grandpa seems to be more old-fashioned. Grandma tells him that times have changed and dogs live indoors in many families today.
- 6. How does Jack feel about living in a dog house or the barn?

 Jack doesn't want to live in a dog house or in the barn. He

 wants to be in the farmhouse with his family.

- 7. What does Grandma say about life in Miguel and Isabel's (New Master and Nice Lady's) home? Grandma says that she and Grandpa are guests there and that their son, Miguel, and their daughter-in-law, Isabel, can run their home any way they want.
- 8. How long has Ben been living with the Fernandez family?

 Ben has been living with the Fernandez family for almost two months.
- 9. Which of the children is usually the one who wants to share food with Jack? Ben usually wants to share food with Jack.
- 10. What does New Master give Ben to play with while the girls are doing their homework? New Master gives Ben a flying disc.
- 11. Does Jack like playing with the flying disc? How do you know? Yes, Jack likes playing with it. Ben throws the disc to him, then claps and smiles when Jack brings it back. Jack and Ben enjoy playing together.
- 12. What breed of dog is Jack? What does it mean to *retrieve* something? Jack is a Labrador Retriever. The breed is good at retrieving, or bringing things back.
- 13. What does New Master think Jack will be good at someday? Why? New Master thinks Jack will be a good hunting dog

- someday. A hunting dog might retrieve small animals, or bring them to the hunter.
- 14. Why does Jack like New Master? Jack likes New Master because he is kind, which reminds Jack of his old master.
- 15. The girls wish Grandpa would stop complaining. What is he complaining about? Grandpa is still complaining about the dogs being in the house. He thinks they will be safe in the barn with the other animals.
- 16. Why does Melanie want Jack in the house, especially at night? Melanie wants Jack in the house because she hears coyotes at night and she's afraid he won't be safe outdoors with the coyotes.
- 17. Do the girls also like playing with Jack and the flying disc?
 Why? Yes, Melanie and Lily also like playing with Jack and
 the flying disc. It's fun to see Jack try to catch the disc and
 bring it back to them.
- 18. What do Grandpa and New Master like to do for fun?

 Grandpa and New Master like to play cards.
- 19. How long has Jack been with the family? Who arrived first, Ben or Jack? Jack has been with the family for over a month. Ben arrived there a few weeks before Jack.

20. Why do you think New Master has to tell Grandpa *once* again how Jack joined the family? Answers will vary. Maybe Grandpa is forgetful and doesn't remember why Jack joined the family.

Chapter 4 – Jimmy's Offer

- 1. This chapter is a flashback. Who calls New Master at the beginning of the chapter? New Master receives a call from his friend, Jimmy.
- 2. Who is Jimmy? How does New Master know him? Jimmy was New Master's commanding officer in the army. He was a major and New Master was a sergeant.
- 3. Why does Jimmy have to find a new home for his dog? Jimmy is moving to Manhattan, and pets are not allowed in his new apartment. Jack would be alone most of the day in the apartment anyway since Jimmy will be working long hours.
- 4. Why does the Fernandez family agree to adopt Jack? Miguel and Isabel agree to adopt Jack because they have plenty of room on the farm. Also, they know their children would love to have another dog.
- 5. Where does Jimmy live? He moved from a house in Florida to an apartment in New York City.

- What does New Master do besides tend to his farm? New Master is a pilot who flies small planes. He also works in construction at times.
- 7. Why does New Master say that Jack seemed to know that he was going to be leaving his old master? What did Jack do? Jack sat back on his hind legs, lifted his paw, and put it right into Jimmy's hand. Also, he whimpered and looked sad.
- 8. Grandpa says that dogs are smart animals. Do you agree with that statement? Why? Answers will vary.
- 9. What was Jack fascinated by during the plane ride from Tampa, FL to NY? Jack was fascinated by the clouds below.
- 10. Who was waiting for New Master and Jack at the Autumn Blaze Station? What were they looking forward to doing? Isabel was waiting for Miguel and Jack at the Station. They were looking forward to surprising their kids with a dog.
- 11. Jack thinks Grandpa likes hearing how he got to the farmhouse. Why does Grandpa ask New Master over and over again how Jack got there? Grandpa probably forgets the story of how Jack came to live with the family.
- 12. Did it snow where Jack used to live? Is he starting to like the snow? It never snowed where Jack used to live, but he is starting to like the snow.

- 13. Jack is adjusting to life at the farmhouse, except for a couple of things. What doesn't he seem to like? Jack doesn't like the dog food his new family is giving him to eat. Also, Jack was used to living in the house with Jimmy and spending time in their backyard. He never lived in a doghouse or in a barn.
- 14. What does Grandpa say about animals eating food that has been made for them rather than table food? He says that animals should eat food that has been made for them, and that Jack will have to get used to life on the farm.
- 15. Grandpa explains why dogs should live in a doghouse or in the barn. What does he say? According to Grandpa, animals have jobs to do on the farm, and you might as well not even have them if they aren't going to earn their keep on the farm.
- 16. What does New Master say to Grandpa about why the kids want the dogs in the house? New Master explains that the kids hear coyotes howling at night and they're worried about the dogs being attacked.
- 17. What is Grandpa's response to what New Master said?
 Grandpa says that the coyotes won't bother the dogs if they're in the barn. Also, Jack should be kept outdoors because Grandma is allergic to his fur.

- 18. Why do you think Grandpa starts to doze off while Melanie is talking to him? Grandpa is older and tires more easily now.
- 19. Why does New Master say they will wait until Ben's a little older to tell him that he was adopted? New Master says that Ben will understand everything better when he's a little older.
- 20. Why is Jack hoping that his old master will come back for him? Jack is having a difficult time adjusting to life on the farm. He has to get used to eating dog food and Grandpa keeps saying that he should live in a doghouse or in the barn.

Chapter 5 – Party Time

- 1. What grade is Melanie in this year? Is she in a new school? Melanie is in the sixth grade. She's in middle school now.
- 2. Does Melanie like her classes? Which subject is difficult for her? She likes her classes, but math is difficult for her.
- 3. According to Lily, what did Melanie say about middle school? According to Lily, Melanie said that middle school is a little like jail.
- 4. What does New Master say about school? What does Nice Lady say about it? New Master says he would like school much more than he did if he could go back and live his life all over again. Nice Lady agrees. She says we don't realize how much fun it is to be in school until we're out of school.
- 5. What did Lily give Melanie for her birthday? Lily painted a picture of Jack and Angelica for Melanie.
- 6. What did Melanie's parents give her? Her parents gave her clothes and a notebook computer.
- 7. Did Grandma and Grandpa also have a gift for Melanie?
 What was it? Grandma and Grandpa gave Melanie a card
 with some money in it.

- 8. What did Ben give Melanie? Ben drew a picture of all the farm animals for Melanie.
- 9. Melanie tells her dad that she is worried about Grandpa. Why is she concerned? Melanie is concerned because Grandpa takes lots of naps now and doesn't remember things as well as he did in the past.
- 10. Why is Melanie glad that Grandma and Grandpa live in a cottage on the farm? She's glad they live in a cottage on the farm because she can see them often.
- 11. Melanie notices that Ben is not as quiet as he was when he first moved in with the family? What does he like to do? Ben likes spending time with the animals.
- 12. What does Lily say when her sister asks if she is happy that the family adopted Ben? What would she like, if it were possible? Lily is happy they adopted Ben. She wishes she could have a little brother but still be the baby.
- 13. What happened to Ben's dad? He died in an accident.
- 14. What does Jack do when he wants attention from Melanie?

 Name some other ways in which pets get attention from people. Jack nudges Melanie's leg or hand when he wants attention.

- 15. What does Lily think about being the middle child now instead of the younger one? She's afraid that being the middle child will not be as special as being the older or younger child.
- 16. What does Melanie tell Lily about her position in the family?

 Melanie tells Lily that she's still the younger girl and now she gets to be a big sister.
- 17. Why is Ben familiar with farm life? Ben's grandparents have a farm in Ohio so he's familiar with farm animals.
- 18. Nice Lady jots something down in a small pad that she keeps in her pocket. What do you think she might be writing? Answers will vary.
- 19. Why does Melanie keep thinking about Grandma and Grandpa? What does her mom tell her? Melanie thinks about Grandma and Grandpa because they're getting older and they won't be around forever. Her mom tells her that nothing in life is guaranteed, but she believes Grandma and Grandpa will be with them for a long time.
- 20. What does Jack think about girl-talk? What does he do when Melanie talks to her mom? Jack doesn't like girl-talk. He leaves the room when Melanie talks to her mom.

Chapter 6 - No Dog Food, Please!

- 1. New Master flips Jack's food around his bowl, and Jack looks at it to see if the flipping has changed the food. Has it? No, flipping the food around hasn't changed it. It's still dog food.
- 2. Jack misses the food he ate at his old master's house. What did his old master give him? His old master gave him hamburgers, hot dogs, and chicken.
- 3. Jack got hurt once when he jumped up on his old master's barbecue. What did he learn from that experience? He learned not to go near the barbecue again.
- 4. What does Ben share with Jack when no one is watching him? Why does Ben like to share what he has with Jack? Ben shares pieces of toast, cucumbers, lettuce, and apples. He also shares bits of his ice cream pops. He loves Jack so he likes to share his food with him.
- 5. When Ben asks his mom and dad if he can share his food with Jack, what do they say? His mom and dad say that dog food is made especially for dogs and that Ben needs to eat his own meals.

- 6. Does Ben listen to his parents? No, Ben secretly continues to share his food with Jack.
- 7. Do New Master and Nice Lady give Jack table food or dog food? What do different pets usually eat? New Master and Nice Lady give Jack dog food.
- 8. Would Jack like to go back to his old home? How do you know? Jack misses his old master and would like to go back to his old home. He sniffs along the fence, but can't figure out how to get back.
- 9. Does Jack like it when Ben and Lily say, "Doggie breath again?" Does he like it better when Melanie pets him? Jack prefers it when Melanie pets him rather than when the younger children hug him and say, "Doggie breath again."
- 21. Does Jack like it when Melanie and Lily put hats on his head? What would he prefer instead of hats? Why? Jack doesn't like having hats put on his head. He could use warm boots, though, because his paws are cold in the snow.

Chapter 7 – Spring is in the Air

Aim/Objectives:

- 1. The Fernandez Family Farm is mostly a produce farm. What does that mean? What do they grow? They grow fruits and vegetables.
- 2. Who taught New Master how to be a farmer? New Master learned from his father.
- 3. What does Grandpa do the old-fashioned way on the farm?

 Does Melanie want to do things the old-fashioned way?

 Grandpa wants to keep the dogs in the barn because that's the way it was on his father's farm. Melanie doesn't want to do things the old-fashioned way. (Understanding)

- 1. What is Jack wondering about the rooster? How are roosters different from dogs? Jack is wondering why the rooster doesn't sleep like he does. Unlike dogs, roosters crow very early in the morning.
- 2. What does Grandpa make Jack do some nights? Does Jack like this? Why? Grandpa makes Jack sleep in the barn with the other animals some nights. Jack doesn't like to sleep in the barn. He wants to be in the house with the family.

- 3. Where does Jack sleep when Grandpa's not around? He sleeps in a bed that New Master and Nice Lady put in a corner of their bedroom.
- 4. Why does Ben follow Jack around? Ben doesn't want Jack to be alone.
- 5. What do New Master and the girls talk about on their way to check on the animals? What did Melanie say she learned in school? New Master asks the girls what they're learning in school. Melanie says she learned that the Native Americans helped the early American farmers grow potatoes, corn, and other crops.
- 6. How did Grandpa learn farming many years ago? What did you learn from your parents or grandparents? Grandpa learned farming from his family and from organizations such as the Future Farmers of America and the local 4-H Club.
- 7. What does Lily like seeing on the farm? Lily likes seeing the new plants grow in the spring.
- 8. What does Melanie like about winter? Melanie likes winter on the farm. She enjoys writing when it's quiet.
- 9. Melanie and Lily have been helping out on the farm since they were little. What have they been doing? Lily started picking strawberries when she was very young. Both girls

helped milk the animals at times. In addition to doing chores on the farm, Melanie helped her mom and grandma in the house.

- 10. Why does the family milk the cows and goats by hand instead of using milking machines? Why do other farmers use milking machines? They only have a few dozen goats and cows, so it doesn't take long to milk them by hand. Also, Grandpa likes to do things the old-fashioned way, the way he was taught.
- 11. Why does New Master say that people get set in their ways sometimes, and change happens slowly for them? Have you found this to be true? Grandpa believes dogs should live outside because that's the way it was on his father's farm. When New Master says people get set in their ways, he means they often continue doing what they're used to doing.
- 12. What does the Fernandez family do with the sheep on their farm? Do they milk them? They don't milk the sheep because sheep produce only a small amount of milk.

 Instead, they breed their sheep and sell some to a local dairy farm that makes different kinds of cheese from sheep's milk.
- 13. Which farm would Melanie like to visit in the spring? She would like to visit the local dairy farm.

- 22. Has Ben milked goats before? Where? Does he want to help out on the Fernandez family farm? Ben has milked goats on his grandfather's farm. He says he's ready to start helping New Master and Grandpa on this farm.
- 14. Why does Jack think cows don't like being milked? Jack thinks cows don't like being milked because they moo all the time.

Chapter 8 – Strange Happenings

- Does Nice Lady cook outdoors a lot like Jack's old master did? Why do you think she prepares meals indoors more often? Jack's old master probably cooked outdoors often because the weather was warmer in Florida. Nice Lady doesn't cook outdoors as often because she lives in a colder climate.
- 2. Who took the bread that Nice Lady made? Why did he take it? Ben took the bread because he wanted to share it with the sheep.
- 3. Something special is happening in this chapter? What is it? A ewe is in labor and is going to give birth to a lamb.
- 4. What is Melanie tired of hearing Grandpa say? Melanie is tired of hearing Grandpa say that Jack belongs outdoors.
- 5. What does New Master say about people having different opinions? Are they entitled to their own opinions? Do you have to agree with them? New Master says that people are entitled to their own opinions, and that you don't have to agree with them.

- 6. Does New Master get upset when Melanie says she'll like it better when Grandpa and Grandma are back in their own house? Why or why not? New Master does not get upset. He says that Melanie is entitled to her opinion, too.
- 7. What does Melanie want to do when she's older? She says she wants to be a writer and a farmer.
- 8. New Master explains that there are fewer farms in the United States than there were years ago, yet they produce more than farms did previously. Why do you think that's the case? What has changed a lot over the years? (Hint: Did people have cell phones a century ago?) Answers will vary. Technology has changed a lot over the years.
- 9. Why does New Master sometimes work in construction in addition to being a farmer? New Master works in construction at times because it's difficult to make a living on a small farm.
- 10. Does Melanie like helping out at the farmers' market? What does she find difficult? Melanie likes helping out at the farmers' market, but packing the boxes is a big job.
- 11. Why do New Master and Grandpa move the ewe to the center of the stall? They move the ewe to the center of the stall so the lamb will have more room to come out.

- 12. Why does New Master wipe the baby lamb's face with a dry towel? New Master wipes the lamb's face and nose with a towel to clear the airway.
- 13. Why does the sheep start to lick the newborn lamb? The sheep licks the lamb to clean, warm, and stimulate it.
- 14. How long after its birth will the baby lamb stand up? The newborn lamb will stand up in about five to ten minutes.
- 15. Has Ben seen a lamb being born before? Where? Ben saw a lamb being born on his grandad's farm.
- 16. Does Ben want his new family to visit his grandad's farm?

 Who does he want his grandparents to meet? Ben wants his new family to visit his grandparents' farm. He wants his grandparents to meet everyone, especially Jack.
- 17. What does Jack think when Grandma goes to the house to get a small blanket for the lamb? What might this indicate? Jack wonders if anyone has a blanket for him. This might indicate that he feels a little jealous of all the attention the newborn lamb is getting.
- 18. What does Ben do while his sisters are at school? He visits the farm animals as often as he can. Also, he plays with a big ball New Master had given him. They play catch sometimes, too.

- 19. Melanie and Lily like to write songs that are actually rhyming poems. Do you like to write songs or poems? What do you enjoy writing? Answers will vary.
- 20. What do you predict will happen next? Will Jack stop wishing for his old master to return? Will he get used to dog food? Will he have to sleep in a doghouse or the barn like Grandpa prefers? Answers will vary.

Chapter 9 - A Scary Night

- 1. What is it called when the author goes back in time to tell us something that happened before the story started? We saw this in an earlier chapter when the author went back in the past to tell us how Jack happened to join the family. It's called a flashback.

- 23. What was the most important part of this chapter? Why? Answers will vary.

- 24. What important thing did Eddie teach the children? He taught them that family's not where you're born, it's where you're loved.
- 25. Describe something important you learned from someone outside of your family. Answers will vary.

Chapter 20 - Grandpa's Story

- 1. What does Jack notice about the way Grandpa is walking?
 What does Jack do? How does Grandpa react to what Jack
 did? Jack notices that Grandpa is moving from side to side
 like he might fall down. He stands very close to Grandpa,
 who reaches out and puts his hands on Jack's back to steady
 himself. Grandpa pats Jack on the back. Then he sits and
 scratches Jack's head.
- 2. What does Melanie have to do for her English class? Melanie has to interview someone in her family for her English class. The person she interviews can't be in her immediate family.
- 3. What does Melanie ask Grandpa first? What does he tell her? (Students should note some of the following information.)

 Melanie asks Grandpa what his life was like when he was little. Grandpa says he was born in Costa Rica. His father worked on a farm, and Grandpa started helping on that farm in elementary school. Grandpa's mother passed away when he was 11. Then he started working long hours on the farm to help take care of his family, which included three younger brothers. When Grandpa was 14, his father moved the family to New York, worked as a farmhand, and finally bought his own farm. Then, just before Grandpa turned 18,

- his father passed away, and Grandpa became a father figure to his younger brothers.
- 4. Is Melanie surprised about Grandpa's early life? What does she say? Yes, she is surprised. Melanie says it's terrible that Grandpa had to support himself and three brothers at the age of 18.
- 5. Why was farming a good fit for Grandpa? What did he learn in trade school? Yes, farming was a good fit for Grandpa since he enjoyed working with his hands and being outdoors. Grandpa liked working in the fields more than he liked going to school. He didn't enjoy school in Costa Rica or in this country. He went to trade school where he learned carpentry and construction.
- 6. Why does Melanie ask Grandpa about the Vietnam War?

 Melanie asks Grandpa about the Vietnam War because her
 friend told her that her grandfather was involved in the War.
- 7. What happened to Grandpa's friend in Vietnam? Grandpa's friend died in Vietnam.
- 8. Who gave Grandpa a pocket watch? Why? His friend's parents gave Grandpa their son's pocket watch after he died.

- 9. How did Grandpa meet Grandma? They went to high school together, but Grandpa was a few years older, so they really didn't know each other. Their fathers were both farmers and bought their supplies at a local store. Grandma and Grandpa met a couple of years later at that store. Grandma looked at Grandpa and smiled, and Grandpa almost fell over a sack of grain.
- 10. What type of foods does the family eat? Who cooks these foods? The family is Costa Rican and Italian. They eat Spanish and Italian food.
- 11. What's wrong with Grandpa's eye? Grandpa's right eye is not as good as it used to be.
- 12. What does Grandpa say about Jack? Is he okay with Jack being in the house now? Why? Grandpa says Jack knows when he needs a little support, even though he's not a guide dog. Also, Grandpa says Jack is very smart, and he's glad that Jack is part of the family.
- 13. What does Melanie think about the food they should give any dogs they might have in the future? Melanie thinks that in the future they should give their puppies dog food from the start so they'll be used to it and there won't be any problems.
- 14. Melanie has something for Grandpa. What is it? Melanie has a cane for Grandpa.

- 15. Does Grandpa like what Melanie gave him? Yes, after he tried to walk with the cane, Grandpa realized it might be helpful for him to use it.
- 16. Is Grandpa more affectionate toward Jack than he was at the beginning of the story? How do you know? Grandpa is more affectionate toward Jack now. He pets Jack and says that he can come inside his home with Melanie.
- 17. Who does Jack consider to be his best buddy? Jack considers

 Ben to be his best buddy.
- 18. What does New Master say about Jack's relationship with Grandpa now? New Master says he knew that Jack would win Grandpa's heart.
- 19. Jack is happy that he's getting table food now. What did he discover about some foods made for dogs, such as a bone that New Master gave him? Jack discovered that some foods made for dogs, such as the bone New Master gave him, are pretty good.
- 20. What does Nice Lady say about people changing their minds about what they like? Do you think that's true? Is there a food you like now that you didn't like when you were younger? Which one? Nice Lady says that people sometimes change their minds about what they like and dogs do also.

- Melanie quietly asks Lily if she's happy the family adopted Ben. How does Lily respond? Lily says she's happy the family adopted Ben. Also, Ben's the baby now. She's in the second grade.
- Does Melanie look out for Lily? How can you tell? Yes,
 Melanie looks out for Lily. She said they should go inside the house because Lily was outside without her jacket.
- 3. What advice does New Master share with Melanie? Who used to tell this to New Master? New Master says that Grandma used to tell him to live one day at a time. Learn from yesterday and plan for tomorrow, but live today. Live one day at a time.
- 4. What does Melanie realize? Which is the most important day of all? Melanie realizes that today is the most important day of all.
- 5. What does New Master say about change? New Master says that sometimes it's difficult when your life changes, but new beginnings can be the start of something even better. Also, New Master says that life isn't perfect and there will be some bumps in the road, but often change is for the best.

- 6. What does Ben say to Jack after New Master talks to Melanie? Ben tells Jack he loves him. Also, he tells Jack they're brothers now and neither of them has to eat dog food.
- 7. Melanie wonders if Jack is a little jealous of the attention Ben gives the lamb. What does Lily tell Melanie? Lily tells Melanie that if Jack is a little jealous of all the attention Ben gives the lamb, he'll get over it. Maybe Lily knows this because she felt jealous of the attention that Ben received when he joined the family, but she got over it.
- 8. Whose birthday is coming soon? New Master says they'll have one more guest at the table. Who do you think that will be? Grandpa's birthday is coming soon. Answers might vary as to who the additional guest will be.
- 9. Melanie and Lily are each going to write songs on their own.
 Why does Melanie say Lily can use her new computer? What will Melanie use to write her song? Melanie would like to write with a pen like she did before she got her computer.
- 10. Who will be visiting the Fernandez Family Farm? When? New Master's old friend, Jimmy, will be visiting the farm soon.
- 11. What does Melanie say about their grumpy old Grandpa?

 Melanie says that their grumpy old Grandpa is really wise.

- 12. Melanie has a math test tomorrow. When is she going to study for it? Why does she change her mind about when she is going to study for the test? What does this indicate about Melanie? Melanie is going to study for her math test first, then she'll read her book. She most likely changes her mind about reading first because she realizes that the test is more important. She can finish her book anytime, even after school the next day.
- 13. What does Melanie like doing the old-fashioned way? Is it understandable that people sometimes like to continue doing things the way they're used to doing them? Why? Melanie likes writing the old-fashioned way, with a pen. Perhaps people like doing things the old-fashioned way at times because it's what they're used to doing. They might be more comfortable doing things the same way rather than trying something new.
- 14. What is Jack wondering about? What did he hear that caught his attention? Jack is wondering why he heard his old master's name.
- 15. According to Jack, where did Ben probably go? Why does Jack want to follow Ben? Jack thinks Ben went to check on the little lamb again. Jack runs after Ben because he wants to be with him.

Ben : "I love you, Jack. You're my brother now and neither of us has to eat dog food."	Ben is a dynamic character. Since he was adopted, he grew to love and understand Jack. Also, he became much more comfortable with everyone else in his family, too.
Melanie: "Sometimes I wonder if Jack isn't a little jealous of all the attention Ben gives the lamb." Lily: "Don't worry. If he is, he'll get over it."	This also shows growth in Lily. She understands that Jack might be a little jealous of the new lamb because she felt the same way about Ben. However, she got over it. Again, Lily is a dynamic character.
Melanie: "I'm going to start studying for my math test. I'll get to it right after I finish reading my book Then again, maybe I'll study for the math test first. After that, I'll finish my book."	Melanie has learned to prioritize. She knows her math test should come first. She can always read her book after the test. This shows that Melanie has matured during the course of the story. Melanie is a dynamic character.
Melanie : "I like the computer. But sometimes I like writing with a pen."	Like Grandpa, Melanie likes doing things the old-fashioned way at times. However, she likes using her new computer, too, and she will use it when she chooses to do so. Again, Melanie is a dynamic character.

Jack: "And where's Ben? I'll bet he went to check on that little lamb again.... WOOF! WOOF! Wait for me!" Jack is a dynamic character. At the beginning of the story, he was obsessed with finding his old master. By the end of the story, Jack was running off to find Ben, the youngest child in the family and the one Jack felt a need to protect the most.

New Master and Nice Lady are wonderful parents, but they don't change much during the course of the story. They're both static characters.
